A habitat is where an animal or plant lives. There are lots of different habitats across the world. Animals and plants need to make sure they are suited to their habitat to survive.

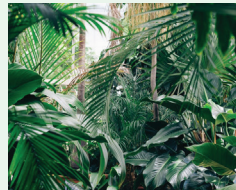

5. Have you discovered any other types of habitat?



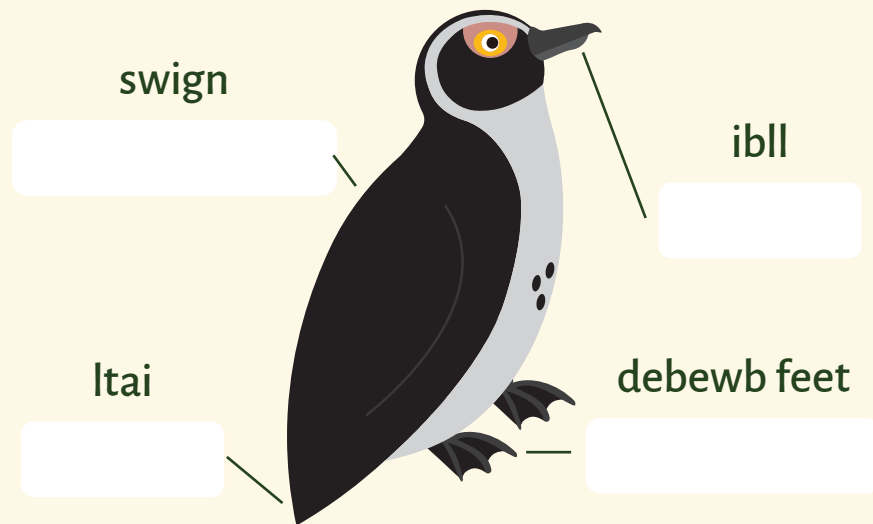
Coastal
